
#### Feedback on Curriculum: 2020-21



- 13. 2.27% teachers strongly disagreed, 6.82% disagreed, 4.54% neither agreed nor disagreed, 45.45% agreed and 40.91% strongly agreed that the test and examination are conducted well in time with proper coverage of all units in the syllabus.
- 14. 15.91% teachers strongly disagreed, 25% disagreed, 27.27% neither agreed nor disagreed, 25% agreed and 6.82% strongly agreed that they have freedom to propose, modify, suggest and incorporate new topics in the syllabus
- 15. 2.27% teachers strongly disagreed, 4.54% disagreed, 20.45% neither agreed nor disagreed, 56.82% agreed and 15.91% strongly agreed in connection with freedom to adopt new techniques/strategies of teaching such as seminar presentations, group discussions and learners' participations.
- 16. 16.0% teachers strongly disagreed, 6.82% disagreed, 11.86% neither agreed nor disagreed, 65.91% agreed and 15.91% strongly agreed in respect of adopting new techniques/ strategies of testing and assessment of students.
- 17. 2.27% teachers strongly disagreed, 4.54% disagreed, 13.64% neither agreed nor disagreed, 75% agreed and 4.54% strongly agreed in respect of having favorable environment in the department for teaching and research.
